### 2 Samuel 6-10

### “The Promise of an Eternal Kingdom”

- 1) In 2 Samuel 6, we see King David doing a good work in a wrong way. How do we sometimes do that in our own walk with the Lord?
  
- 2) We see that in transporting the ark, David followed the worldly example the Philistines used rather than what God required in OT law. What are some ways we can find ourselves following worldly examples rather than God’s Word?

How can we do battle in order to follow God’s Word?

- 3) In 2 Samuel 7, God promises to raise up an eternal king from the line of David. How is this fulfilled both immediately and ultimately?

What is the eternal significance for us that Jesus is our eternal King? How does that impact the way we live day-to-day?

- 4) David listens to God’s promise, receives it, and then worships. How do we struggle to do this sometimes?

- 5) What is God’s greatest promise to us that we are to simply receive?

Why do we sometimes think we need to earn God’s salvation rather than receive it? How can you pray for each other in this?
